-Holy Communion will be celebrated April 7th and 21st.

-Council will meet for their regular monthly meeting Wednesday April 17th at 6:00pm. Following the conclusion of the season of Lent, they are returning to their normal schedule of the 3rd Wednesday of the month.

Then Peter came and said to [Jesus], "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him "Not seven times, but I tell you, seventy-seven times." Matthew 18:21-22

This is an odd little passage. While its aimed at the idea of forgiveness within the body of Christ, I think the underlying theme is reconciliation. I've reflected on this idea before, that one of the "Goals" within the Christ-Event is to make reconciliation possible. It may not always happen...but Jesus makes it possible.

Now reconciliation takes on a lot of forms, but one mental image that comes to mind is meeting in the middle. Finding common ground and starting from there. And then my pop-culture obsessed mind starts playing the old Diamond Rio song "I'd start walking your way, you'd start walking mine. We'd meet in the middle 'neath that old Georgia Pine."

Compromise. Common Ground. Meeting in the Middle.

I feel like this should be a no-brainer...but shouldn't these common ideas be a given? Let's be adults here. Absolutely anything that involves more than 1 person involves this sort of thing. Now here's my question. Collectively, how are we doing on that front these days?

In January's article, I reflected on the call of Christ for us to love one another, and I hinted pretty heavily that this is something we should be considering as we move into an election year...which seems to get more and more contentious in our nation every time. And now, in the 24-hour period leading up to me sitting down and writing this article, something happened that's got me thinking about it again.

I received a message from an individual that is helping collect signatures in order to get someone on the ballot for one of our local races. The individual and the race in question aren't important. But when I got the message, I had to stop and think about it. Admittedly, I don't really know the potential candidate very well, but I do know that they lean the opposite side of the political spectrum from me.

But as I considered the request, I realized that this is an individual who is willing to step into a role serving the public. Because at its heart...isn't that what elections are really about? Maybe it's a little easier to see that (or to believe it) at the small local level rather than on the national stage. But shouldn't it be true regardless of the level we're talking about?

And so, with that in mind, I added my name to the list of signatures they need to be on the ballot.

The 8th Commandment instructs us to not bear false witness against our neighbor, and in the Small Catechism, Martin Luther reminds us that we are to come to the defense of our neighbor, "speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light."

For too long I fear each of us has gone along with the divisive nature of partisanship...and I've seen too many bumper stickers, flags, political ads, and everything else under the sun that seeks to demonize and dehumanize. And Lord knows I've been involved in plenty of conversations that have done the exact same thing. I'll include myself in this whole deal too.

But...is it possible for us to look at this WHOLE deal as an opportunity to for reconciliation? Can we, as followers of Christ, actually live out our day to lives, carry on conversations, or take action that might serve as an example of ways to turn down the heat?

I started this article with verses about forgiveness...and while that is probably applicable...I find myself hoping for some honest and heartfelt effort for reconciliation in this whole deal. What do you think folks?

Is it time that we all start actively trying to meet in the middle?
