Brief Order of Confession and Forgiveness

P: We gather in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit

C: Amen

P: Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen

P: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness

(Pause for silent reflection)

Most merciful God...

C: We confess that we are in bondage to sin, and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. Amen

P: Almighty God, in his mercy, has given his Son to die for us, and for his sake, forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained minister of the Church of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen

Prayer of the Day

P: Let us pray...

(Pastor offers various petitions)

C: Sovereign God, ruler of all hearts, you call us to obey you, and you favor us with true freedom. Keep us faithful to the ways of your Son, so that as we leave behind all that hinders us, we may steadfastly follow your paths, through Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. Amen

Responsive Reading Psalm 16:1-11

L: Protect me O God, for I take refuge in you; I have said to the Lord, "You are my Lord, my good above all other"

C: All my delight is in the godly that are in the land, upon those who are noble among the people

L: But those who run after other gods shall have their troubles multiplied

C: I will not pour out drink offerings to such gods, never take their names upon my lips

L: O Lord, you are my portion and my cup; it is you who uphold my lot

C: My boundaries enclose a pleasant land; indeed I have a rich inheritance

L: I will bless the Lord who gives me counsel; my heart teaches me night after night

C: I have set the Lord always before me; because God is at my right hand, I shall not be shaken

L: Therefore my heart is glad, and my spirit rejoices; my body also shall rest in hope

C: For you will not abandon me to the grave, nor let your holy one see the pit

L: You will show me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy

C: In your right hand are pleasures forevermore

Scripture Lesson

Luke 9:51-62

When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. And he sent messengers ahead of him. On their way they entered a village of the Samaritans to make ready for him; but they did not receive him, because his face was set towards Jerusalem. When his disciples James and John saw it, they said, 'Lord, do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?' But he turned and rebuked them. Then they went on to another village. As they were going along the road, someone said to him, 'I will follow you wherever you go.' And Jesus said to him, 'Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.' To another he said, 'Follow me.' But he said, 'Lord, first let me go and bury my father.' But Jesus said to him, 'Let the dead bury their own dead; but as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God.' Another said, 'I will follow you, Lord; but let me first say farewell to those at my home.' Jesus said to him, 'No one who puts a hand to the plough and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.'

Apostles Creed
